General Terms of Use for Internet Access via the Wi-Fi (wireless network) of M3B GmbH (as of March 2018)

Preliminary note:

M3B GmbH (hereinafter called "MESSE BREMEN") permits the exhibition participant (hereinafter called "Participant") the use of MESSE BREMEN's network structures for the purpose of internet usage via the Wi-Fi (wireless network). The following terms apply to the usage of MESSE BREMEN's Wi-Fi in relation to the Participant:

1. Contractual relationships

Use of the Wi-Fi in the event rooms of MESSE BREMEN during the execution of the respective exhibition concerned is agreed on between MESSE BREMEN and the Participant on the basis of a separately signed agreement for a charge/free of charge.

The contractual relationship between MESSE BREMEN and the Participant comes into effect

either with the handing over of the access authorization as well as with the first login at a Wi-Fi access point (hereinafter called "Access Point or AP") using the access data provided to the Participant and activation of the Wi-Fi access by MESSE BREMEN (hereinafter called "Portal Mode")

or with the entry of a password given by MESSE BREMEN to the Participant in the Participant's Wi-Fi enabled end device (hereinafter called "Exhibition Mode").

As the access provider, MESSE BREMEN only enables the Participant access to the internet without checking the information provided or retrieved by the Participant. In the Portal Mode, authentication of the Participant within the Wi-Fi is via the access data of the Participant.

2. Services of MESSE BREMEN

MESSE BREMEN provides the following services under the existing technical and operational capabilities.

2.1 Access to the internet

MESSE BREMEN allows the Participant access to the internet via the Wi-Fi for wireless use of the internet.

Wi-Fi technology enables wireless data transmission between the wireless access point (AP) of MESSE BREMEN and the Wi-Fi enabled end device of the Participant. Transmission speed during use is among other things dependent on the network load of the internet backbone, the transmission rate of the selected server of the respective content provider, and the number of users at the Wi-Fi AP concerned.

Wireless data transmission between the Wi-Fi AP and the Wi-Fi enabled end device of the Participant is always encrypted. Within the MESSE BREMEN meeting rooms the wireless connection is thus secured against access by

third parties according to the current state of the art.

The Wi-Fi offer does not include a firewall or virus protection. The use of the internet and the transmission of data, in particular via a Wi-Fi connection, are thus associated with increased security risks. To ensure data traffic security, especially for the transmission of sensitive data, the Participant is recommended to use a suitable software (e.g. VPN software). MESSE BREMEN is not liable for unauthorized access to information and data that are transmitted via the Wi-Fi connection, and which is due to inadequate security measures on the part of the Participant and/or incorrect use, except for as under 4.1.

2.2 Technical requirements for end devices

For the use of the Wi-Fi a functioning end device (e.g. laptop or PDA) with a Wi-Fi enabled interface in accordance with IEEE 802.11b or IEEE 802.11g is required. Furthermore, a suitable operating system, web browser, the current driver software of the Wi-Fi hardware and a corresponding IP network protocol must be installed (with activated DHCP protocol for the automatic retrieval of network addresses). No proxy servers should be configured in the operating system or the used browsers. Permanent routing entries are also not permitted.

In addition, the end device or its operating system must meet the latest encryption standards. For devices that do not meet these standards, a wireless internet access can only be provided on request in exceptional cases, and with explicit reference to the increased security risk of unauthorized access by third parties to data transmission.

3. Obligations of the Participant

3.1 The following obligations shall apply to the Participant:

Improper use of MESSE BREMEN's services is not permitted, in particular

- the simultaneous connection of an end device with wireless and wire-based LAN of MESSE BREMEN is not permitted.
- own Wi-Fi infrastructures may only be set up after prior consultation with MESSE BREMEN (see 3.2.)
- the Participant must refrain from the unsolicited sending of messages or information to third parties for advertising purposes (spamming).
- these are not to be used for attempting to achieve unauthorized retrieval of information or data or for unauthorized intrusion into data networks.
- no executable routines (e.g. spyware, dialers, etc.) are to be automatically, without authorization, or secretly transferred to the internet users' computers.
- no information with illegal or immoral content may be disseminat-

ed. This includes information that is used in the sense of § 130, 130a and 131 of the Criminal Code for sedition, for encouraging crime or for glorifying or trivializing violence, is sexually offensive, is pornographic in the sense of § 184 of the Criminal Code, might morally endanger children or young people or affect their welfare, or harm the reputation of MESSE BREMEN. The provisions of the Youth Media State Treaty and the Youth Protection Act are to be complied with.

Personal access data may not be passed on to third parties and must be kept protected against access by third parties.

3.2 Obligations of users of their own Wi-Fi infrastructure

Under certain conditions, it is permitted to use one's own Wi-Fi.

- MESSE BREMEN must be informed of any intention to use one's own Wi-Fi Apps in writing prior to the event using the form provided in the service handbook.
- The permitted frequency must be only 5 GHz in accordance with IEEE 802.11 h. Exceptions require written approval by MESSE BREMEN.
- The transmission power must be set so that other Wi-Fi participants are not affected in their use of the Wi-Fi.

3.3 Legal consequences of violations

If the Participant violates against their obligations pursuant to the above paragraphs 3.1 or 3.2, MESSE BREMEN is entitled - even in the case of a single case of violation - to terminate without previous notice and for good cause the contractual relationship with the Participant and to exclude the Participant who has violated one of the obligations of the aforementioned 3.1 from the use of the Wi-Fi (Exhibition Mode), or to block the respective connection (Portal Mode). Further, MESSE BREMEN reserves the right to make claims for damages as well as to take criminal proceedings in the event of violations against the obligations in paragraph 3.1, indent 3.

4. Liability of MESSE BREMEN and indemnification obligation of the Participant

4.1 Liability of MESSE BREMEN

Claims for damages and reimbursement of expenses (hereinafter together called "claims for damages") made by the Participant against MESSE BREMEN are excluded unless they are based on an intentional or grossly negligent breach of its obligations on the part of MESSE BREMEN, on an at least negligent breach of an essential contractual obligation, or on harm to the body, life or health of the Participant.

In the event of an at least negligent

breach of an essential contractual obligation the claims for damages made by the Participant against MESSE BREMEN are limited to contract-typical, foreseeable damages. Contract-typical/foreseeable damage is that which is typically to be expected due to violation of the obligation concerned. Essential contractual obligations are those which enable or ensure the fulfillment of the contract. Contract-typical/foreseeable damage is that which is generally (typically) to be expected due to violation of the obligation concerned.

4.2 Indemnification obligation of the Participant

If third parties make claims against MESSE BREMEN on account of actions or omissions that have been brought about or caused by the Participant in the context of Wi-Fi usage the Participant is obliged to fully indemnify MESSE BREMEN in respect of claims made by that third party upon first demand. Furthermore, the Participant has to reimburse to MESSE BREMEN all costs incurred in connection with the claim of that third party.

5. Content responsibility

The Participant is itself responsible to MESSE BREMEN and third parties for the content that is retrieved, added or in any way disseminated via the Wi-Fi of MESSE BREMEN. The contents are not subject to inspection by MESSE BREMEN.

6. Place of jurisdiction

All claims and rights in relation to MESSE BREMEN that are connected with the use of MESSE BREMEN's Wi-Fi are to be asserted exclusively before the Bremen city courts in so far as the Participant is a registered trader.

7. Written form

Changes and/or additions to these Terms must be in writing to be effective. This also applies to the repeal and/or amendment of this written form requirement.

8. Severability clause

Should any of the provisions contained in these Terms of Use and/or the respective contract of which these Terms of Use are a part be or become invalid, this shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of these terms or respective contract. Instead of the invalid provision, the parties shall agree on a provision that is in its entirety in accordance with the commercial intention or, should this not be legally possible, that legally fulfils this intention to as large an extent as possible.
